# App Concept

Crep Collect is an app that primarily allows sneaker collectors to document, track and share their sneaker collection. It also facilitates the creation of a wanted list of sneakers that the user would like to purchase in the future. In addition, there is a 'Releases' section to keep up to date with upcoming releases and allow them to be added to the user's collection or wanted list.

# Target Audience

The target audience of the app is sneaker collectors. There is a large market of consumers who collect limited-edition sneakers for several purposes such as to wear, hold on to or as an investment. Cowen (2020) estimates the sneaker resale market to be worth \$30 billion by 2030 [1].

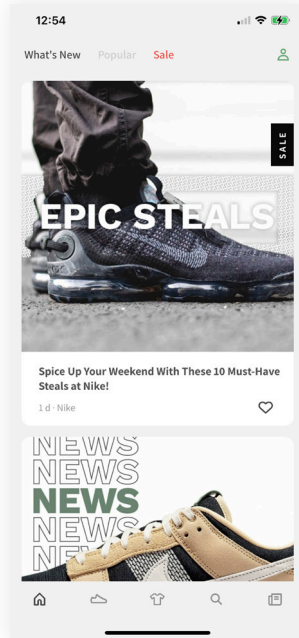
# Requirements

- An API which returns an array of sneakers from a query input. Each sneaker item needs the following data: name, SKU, brand and image URL.
- Authentication service for handling user authentication.
- Database for holding user collection and wanted data.
- Shoe related icons will be needed for the app icon and tab bar icons.

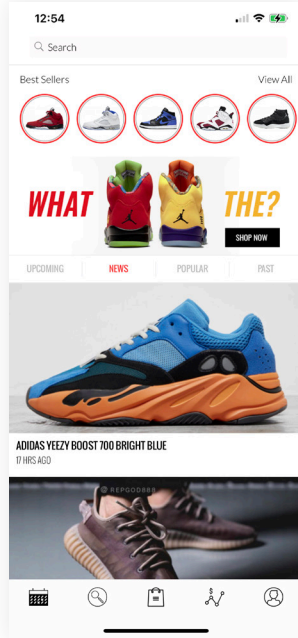

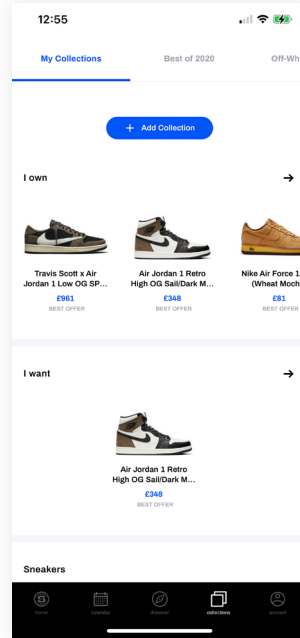

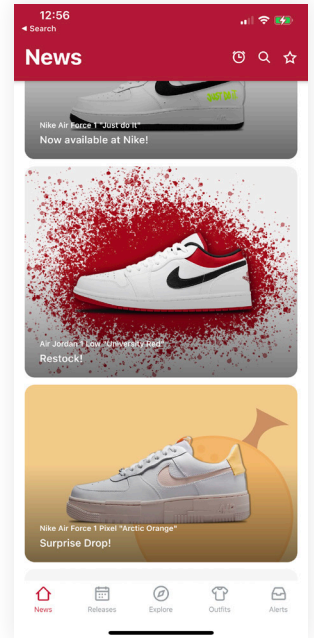

- No wanted or collection list

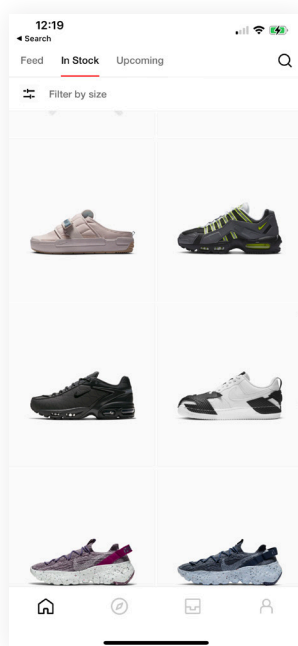

Nike's app for selling limited edition sneakers.

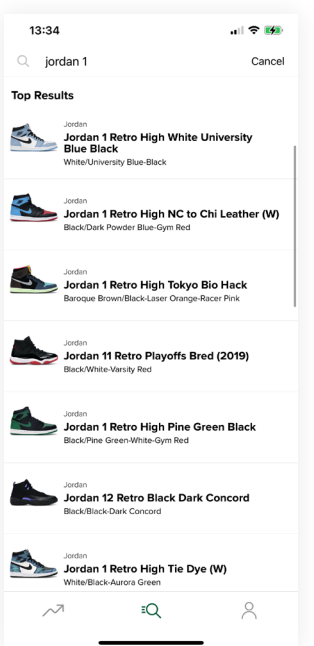
Very effective use of images of sneakers, dominating the screen and allowing users to focus on the aesthetics of the sneakers.

Provides an example of an effective search of a database of sneakers, returning consistent imagery and presenting the information to the user effectively.

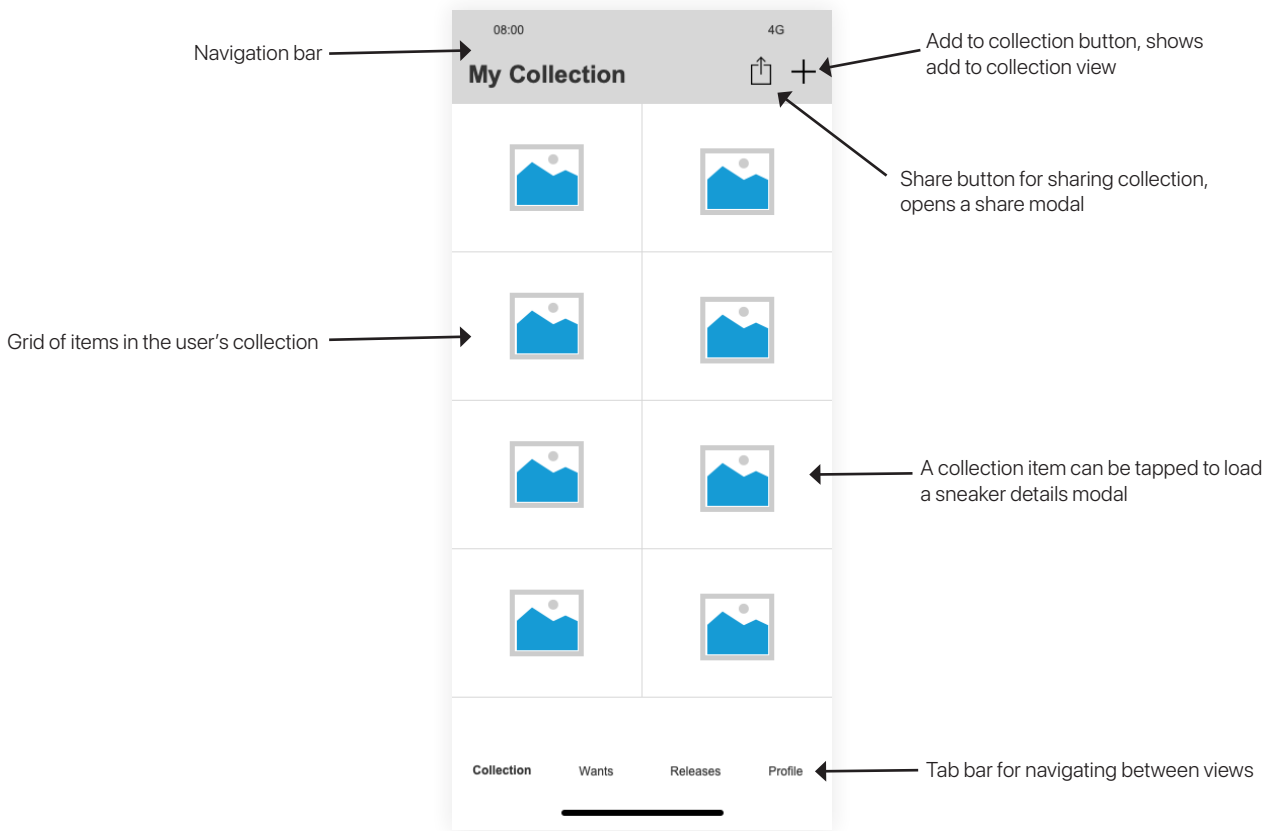


**Main finding:** Effective and consistent use of sneaker images can provide an immersive and engaging user experience.

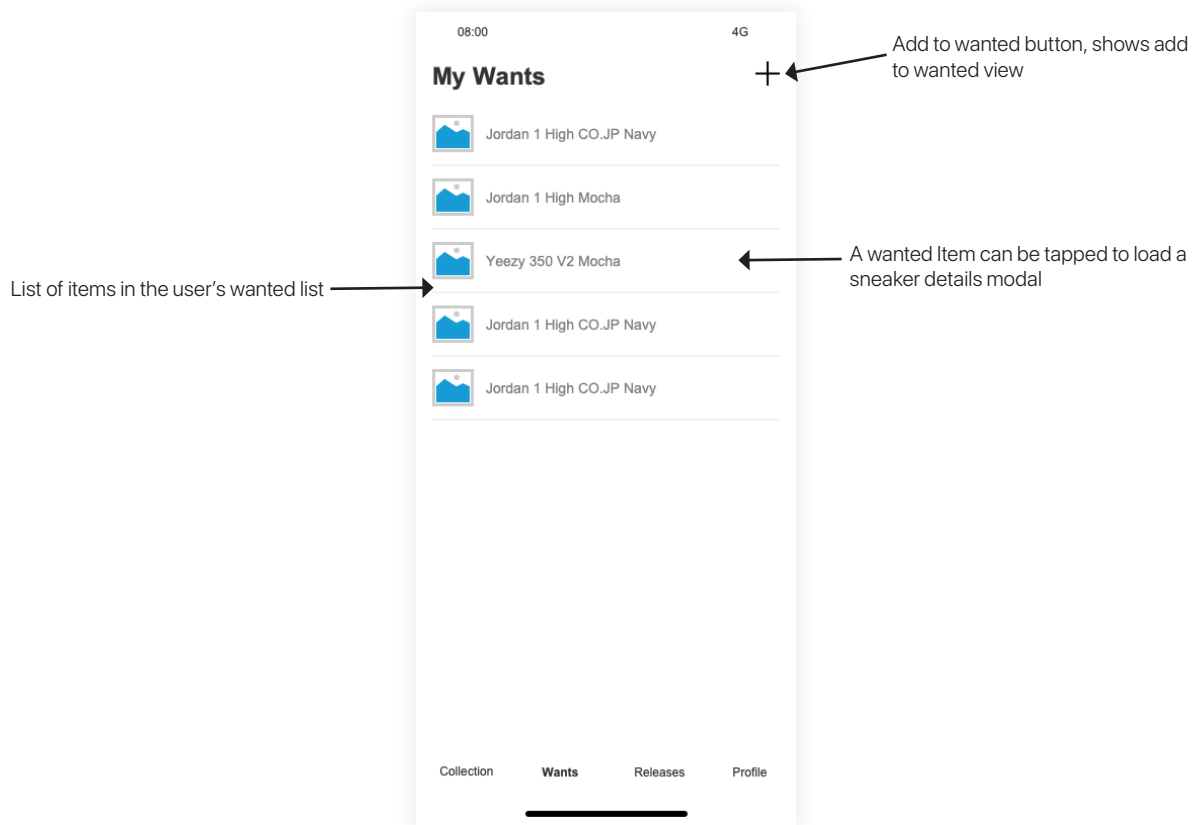
## My Collection

Screen for the user's collection



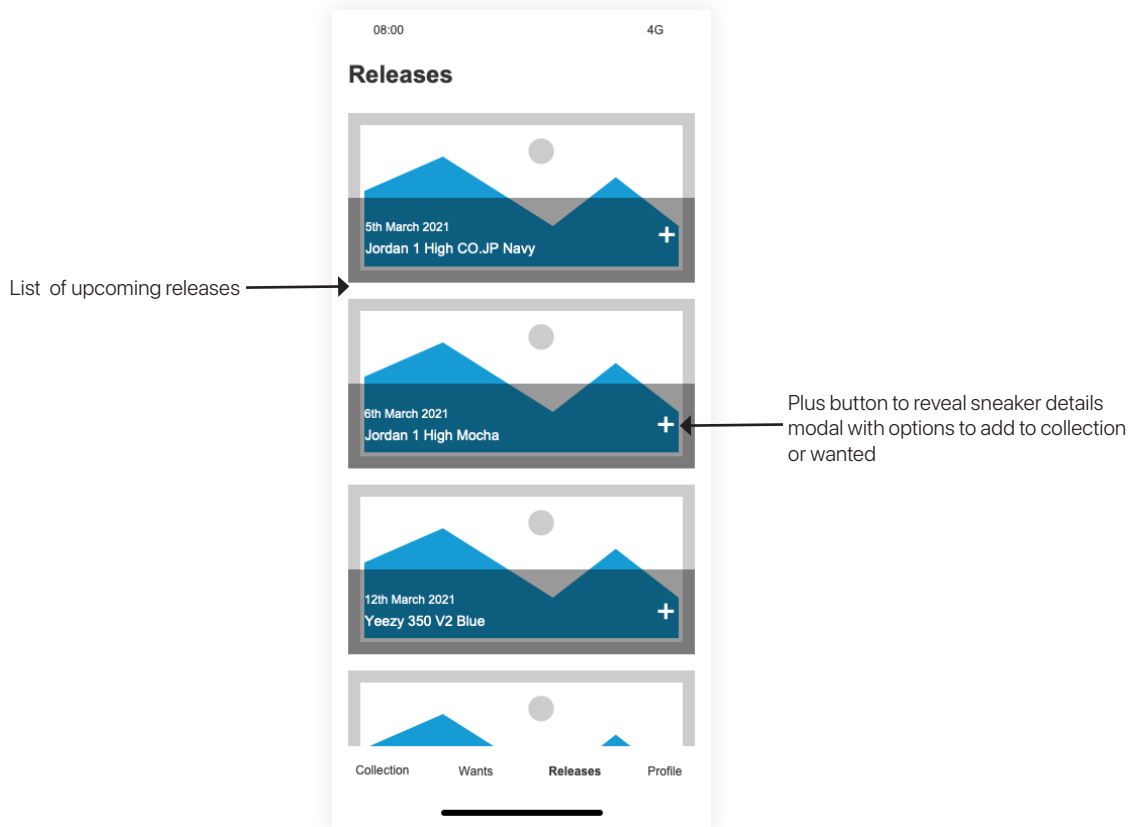
## My Wanted

Screen for showing user's wanted list



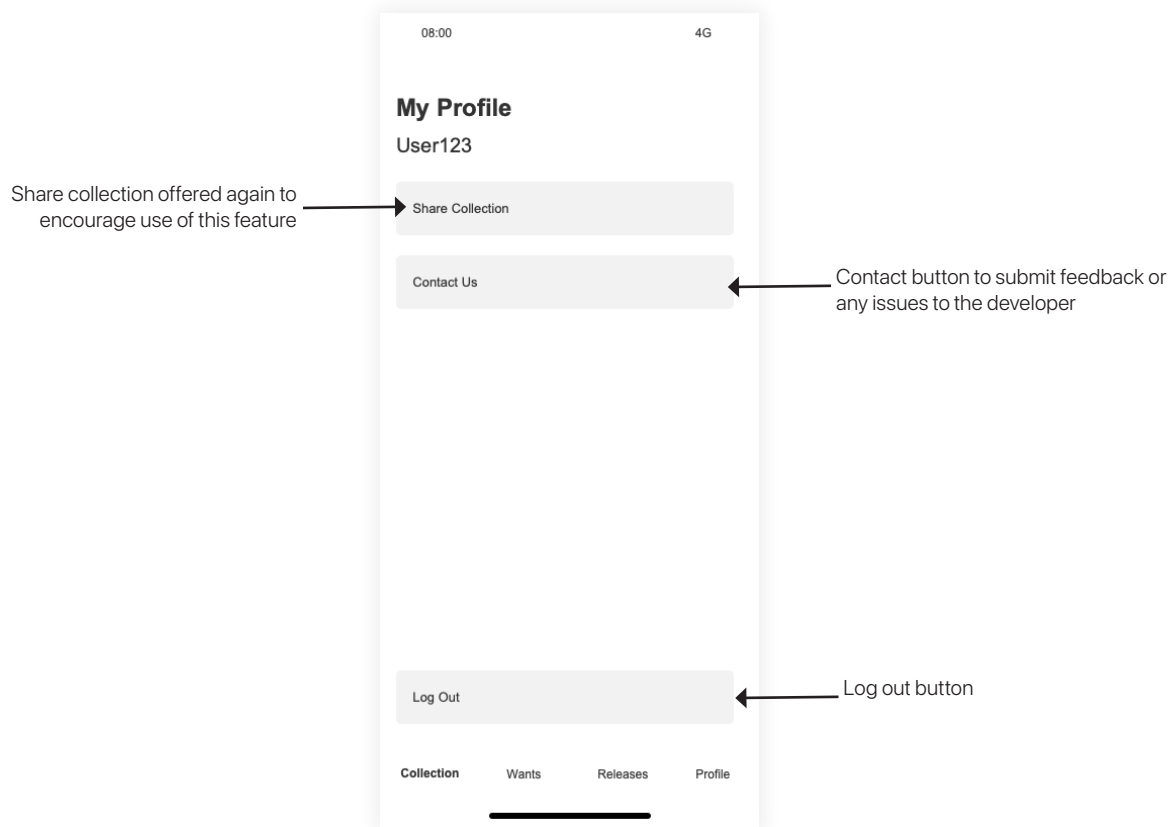
## Releases

Screen for displaying user profile and providing actions

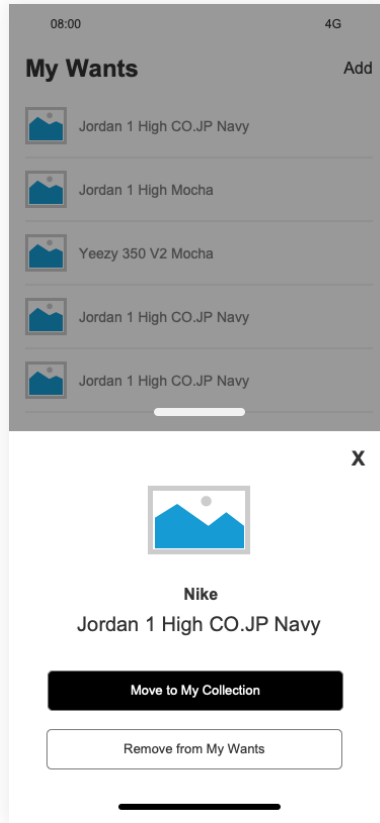


## Sneaker Details Modal

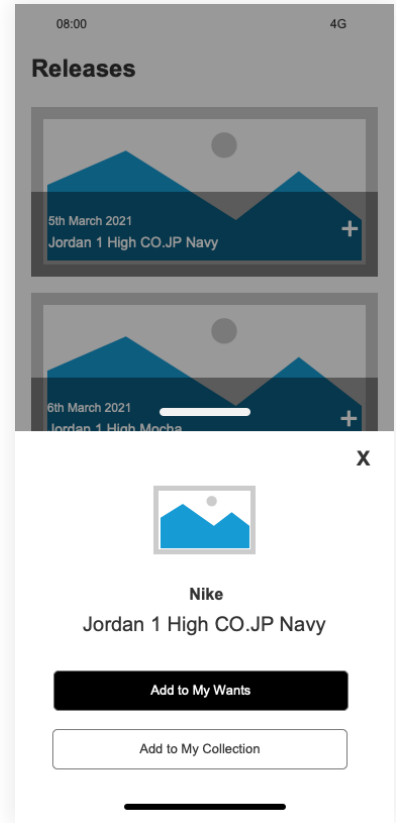
Bottom sheet style modal view used when tapping a sneaker.  
Shows more details for a sneaker and provides actions depending on the view.



When tapping a collection item, more details and a button to remove the item are shown.



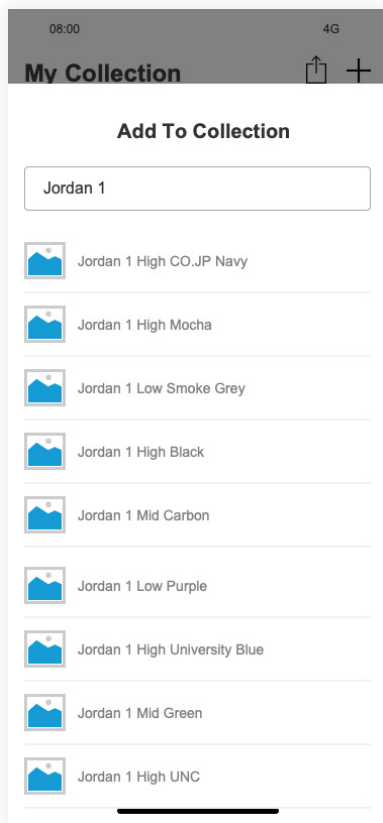
When tapping a wanted item, more details and buttons to move the item to collection or remove it from wanted are shown.



When tapping a release item, more details and buttons to add to collection or wanted are shown.

## Add to Collection or Wanted

Screen to search for a desired sneaker.  
Once a sneaker is tapped, a modal is presented to confirm adding it to collection or wanted.



## Empty View

Used on My Collection and My Wanted screens when user has no items yet

User is communicated that the view is empty and given a prompt for how to solve this

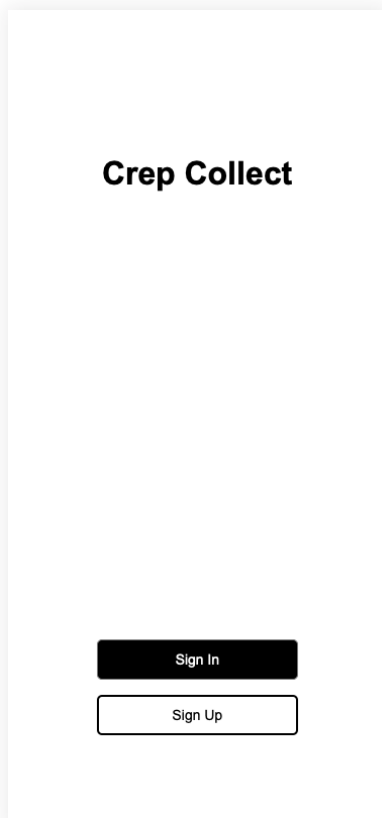


Full width call to action in the center of screen aims to get users attention and encourage adding to collection

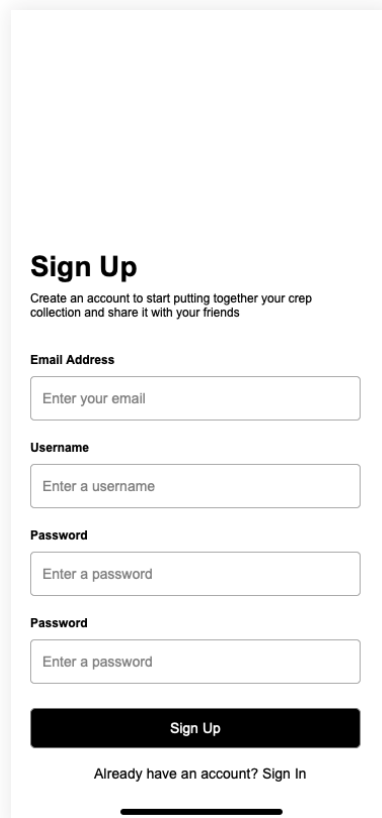

Screens used when the user has not yet signed up or signed in

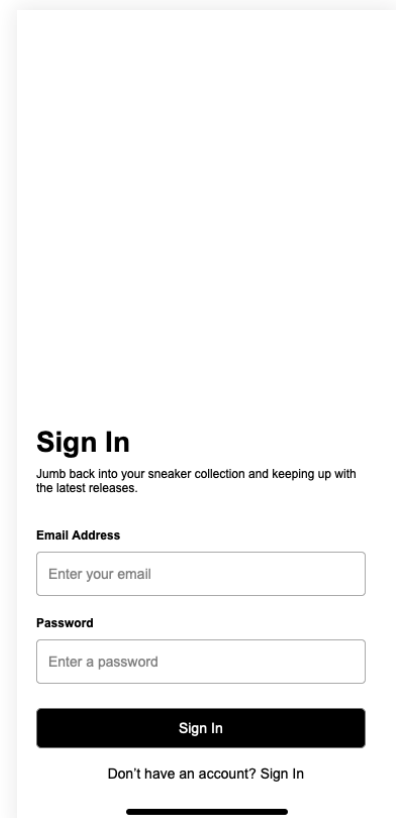

# Branding

## Name

The name Crep Collect was chosen as it is catchy and memorable, utilising alliteration. It is also appropriate as Crep is a British informal word for sneakers/ trainers [2] and collect refers to the gathering together of items [3].

## Logo

The Crep Collect logo consists of a simple illustration [4] of an outline of a sneaker situated above "Crep Collect" text. Pacifico [5], a handwriting style font was selected to give the impression of an informal and fun app. The curved nature of the font resembles shoelaces as the text is joined together and overlaps.

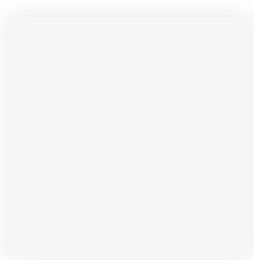
## App Icon

The use of the same sneaker outline illustration used in the logo is used to provide a simple but identifiable app icon.



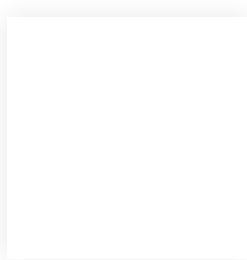
## Colour Scheme

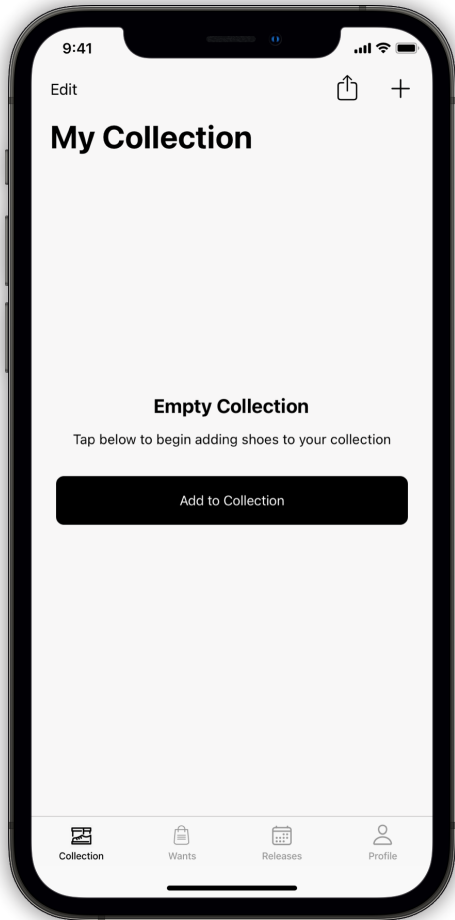
